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F-1 Student Concurrent Enrollment Application

To document full time enrollment for UConn F-1 students taking courses at another U.S. institution.

When UConn international students take a portion of their full time coursework at a different U.S. institution, this is called “concurrent enrollment”. ISSS must approve your concurrent enrollment request when the off-site coursework takes place during the academic semester (Fall/Spring), or when you are taking courses during a vacation term, and that is your final term (Summer or Winter term, when you are graduating that term). **ISSS only approves concurrent enrollment for courses that have been pre-approved by UConn for transfer credit.
